News from Tabora

We received a communication from Bishop Elias this week that told of a fire in the old girl's dormitory at St. Peter's School. The girls were taken to St. Philip's clinic and the local hospital for symptoms of shock. There were no further injuries. As this occurs in the midst of the election season the authorities are investigating a possible link with extremism.

The shell of the building survived the fire, but the beds, mattresses, and all the personal property of the girls were lost.

Please pray for the girls of St. Peter's School in the weeks ahead.

Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever."
