

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The Doors! The Doors! In wisdom let us attend!--Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom.

The Deacon's exhortation quoted above is not about the rock band responsible for "Riders on the Storm", but literally about closing the doors of the Church before the recitation of the Nicene Creed.

Today, let us attend to the doors in wisdom for there is a proclamation made in metal.



Notice, first the horn motif mentioned last week.

Secondly, if polished (and that is a task that is a near impossibility) the brass "rivets" combined with the handles form the Alpha & Omega a symbol for Jesus Christ.

the last letters in the Greek alphabet) in Revelation 1:8 and it is an important motif through the book confirming the identity of Jesus Christ as God. In Rev. 21:6 John the Revelator reports, "And he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end." Yet, the reader of Scripture should not be surprised to read this in Revelation. The idea of God as first and last is found in Isaiah, "Thus says the LORD, the King of Israel and his Redeemer, the LORD of hosts: "I am the first and I am the last; besides me there is no god." (Isa. 44:6) And again, "Listen to me, O Jacob, and Israel, whom I called! I am he; I am the first, and I am the last." (Isa. 48:12)

This identification of Jesus with YHWH, the God of Israel, is communicated with the location of the Alpha and Omega on the door. In one of Jesus' controversial statements in the Gospel of John he states, "I AM the door of the sheep." This use of I AM is a direct claim to continuity and identity with the God who revealed himself to Moses in Exodus 3.14, "God said to Moses, I AM WHO I AM". For Jesus' hearers this would engender controversy.

Jesus, however, does not stop there, he continues in Joh 10:9, "I AM the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture."

Jesus is the door and only by entering through him can we be saved. Our very own Church door makes this proclamation in metal. Would it surprise you to discover that this proclamation is as controversial today as it was during Jesus earthly ministry?

Exodus 34:29-35

Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; but whenever Moses went in before the Lord to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2

Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God.

Luke 9:28-36

About eight days after Peter had acknowledged Jesus as the Christ of God, Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake,

they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"--not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.
