



All Saint and All Souls

Over the years these days have been conflated in the liturgical practice of The Episcopal Church, but they are distinct commemorations and worthy of their own celebrations.

All Saints' Day is the commemoration of all those who have received the blessing of full sanctity in this life, but may not be officially remembered in any Church Kalendar of observances. These would be holy women and men who lived lives of service and devotion, whose passing may have been noticed locally, but escaped the attention of the Church at large. These would also be those who gave the ultimate witness to the faith through martyrdom, and whose names are now forgotten, except maybe by their own loved ones. So, All Saints' might appropriately be called the Commemoration of the Anonymous Saints.

All Souls' Day is the day of prayer for all the faithful departed. In other words, all those who did not quite make it to sainthood, but who were united to Christ in Baptism. At the service on this day we remember all who have died, especially those of the last year, and any whose names are given to the clergy.

If you wish to have a particular person commemorated at the Mass on All Souls' Day please let me or Deacon Tim know. Since the celebration is held in the Chapel, all those whose names are recorded at the Columbarium will be remembered as well.

The Epistle

1 Thessalonians 2:1-8

You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, but though we had already suffered and been shamefully mistreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.

The Gospel Matthew 22:34-46 When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest

with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question: "What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying,

'The Lord said to my Lord,

"Sit at my right hand,

until I put your enemies under your feet"'?

If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?" No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.
