**Sunday, June 28**

Psalm 118 *This is the day that the LORD hath made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.* (v.24 ESV)

Wouldn't it be renewing if each morning we would allow the refrains of that verse to wash over us? "Grant me to make an unflawed beginning today," was the prayer of C.S. Lewis as he invited the Holy Spirit to take command of his day. He wisely counseled that if we cultivated this intimacy with God, it would lead to a contented heart, one that was resting, trusting in His care as our day unfolded. *My Jesus Calling* devotional suggests we step back from our natural fussing and fretting as our day begins and "meet God in the morning stillness while the earth is fresh with the dew of his presence." When I was a young adult residing in Pittsburgh, one of our wealthier dioceses purchased a stunning site for the construction of its new church. There were many parishioners eager to contribute to the stained glass windows they assumed would be the surround for the altar. The church architect, however, convinced the building committee to leave the floor-to-ceiling windows clear and to site the

church so that a range of the Allegheny Mountains could be captured instead. The kneelers at the altar were needlepointed with the first two verses of this psalm. In spring, pink and white dogwoods yielded to summer's lush greens, and then fall's splash of color was tempered by snow-covered evergreens. While this spectacle didn't honor saints or martyrs, it dramatized instead God's own handiwork—balm for our senses and souls.
