Now, the details as I have received them, and I am writing before the official ending press conference occurs, is that the Primates of the Anglican Communion, meeting in Canterbury, have essentially suspended TEC representatives from having vote in official Anglican Communion meetings, thought they will retain their "voice" at those meetings. This will last for a period of three years.

What this looks like will take a while to work out. What this means will take even longer to work out. I ask that space be given for all of us to work out what this means.

I know that we will run the gamut of responses to this announcement. Yet, this is not the time for despair, anger, resentment, or even triumphalism. It is a time for prayer and reflection.

It is no secret that we are not all of one voice on the issue that is dividing the Communion, but I will stress that no member of this congregation will be treated differently due to a disagreement on this issue. All who wish to follow Jesus Christ are welcome at St. Matthew's and all will be treated with dignity, respect and love.

And that, my friends, is our regular programming. I, for one, will not allow the turmoil which is Anglicanism deter us from what we are called to do and be. We are called to be disciples of Jesus Christ and to call others to the new life of discipleship.

The Gospel

John 2:1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
