McLean County Parish

Several years ago the Diocese in Synod adopted a vision statement that proclaimed that the Diocese is organized for mission into Geographic Parishes.

Last year the Diocese in Synod changed the Canons to reflect this vision with new terms for Parishes and other congregations.

This year, Bishop Daniel is taking a special interest in bringing the vision to reality here in McLean County.

To that end, in March Christ the King hosted a joint meeting for the Mission Leadership Teams, Bishop, and clergy of both Eucharistic Communities. On 14 October, St. Matthew's hosted a follow-up meeting with the Mission Leadership Teams of Christ the King and St. Matthew's, Bishop Daniel, and yours truly. The point of these meetings was to discover ways in which the vision for joint mission in the Parish of McLean County could move forward.

At the conclusion of the October 14th meeting, a way forward was charted, and conversations have continued. These conversations had to remain confidential until leaders who were not present were brought up to speed. That has finally happened, so we are relieved to be able to share our observations at the fora (forums?)

The Epistle

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

O Lord, do not tarry.

We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord forever. Therefore encourage one another with these words.

The Gospel

Matthew 25:1-13

Jesus said, "Then the kingdom of heaven will be like this. Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. When the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them; but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. As the bridegroom was delayed, all of them became drowsy and slept. But at midnight there was a shout, 'Look! Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' Then all those bridesmaids got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise replied, 'No! there will not be enough for you and for us; you had better go to the dealers and buy some for yourselves.' And while they went to buy it, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went

with him into the wedding banquet; and the door was shut. Later the other bridesmaids came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I do not know you.' Keep awake therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour."
